On 11 March 2023, the Brothers of Phi Gamma Gamma Chapter in Kaiserslautern, Germany, rallied the local community to support the devastating earthquake victims in Turkiye on 6 February 2023. Over ten thousand people died in the earthquake, and hundreds of thousands lacked shelter, food, and clothing.

The Turkish Army, part of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) contingent at Ramstein Air Force Base in Ramstein, Germany, put out a community call for assistance with winter clothing, blankets, hygiene items, and other disaster items.

The Brothers of PGG collected over 500 pounds of winter clothing and other requested items. Brigadier General Omer Gulmezoglu of the Turkish Army greeted the Brothers with great appreciation for their response to the call for assistance. General Gulmezoglu requested the Brothers and members of the Turkish Army link arms together for a photo showing solidarity in supporting the country of Turkiye and its affected citizens.

Phi Gamma Gamma donates blood as tribute to Dr. Charles Richard Drew and support to the Armed Forces across Europe, Africa, and Middle East.



In honor of the great Dr. Charles Richard Drew, the Brothers of Phi Gamma Gamma donated blood during the Armed Services Blood Program (ASBP) Europe Blood Drive on February 1, 2022, at Rhine Ordnance Barracks, Germany.

The ASBP Blood Drive supports real-world operations, live-fire training exercises throughout Europe, Africa, and the Middle East, and patients in military medical facilities overseas. The members of Phi Gamma Gamma attended the blood drive enthusiastically and in full force. They range from retired and active duty military to civilians supporting the military.

At the blood drive, Vice Basileus Randy Jeter stated, "Collectively, Phi Gamma Gamma understands and appreciates the sacrifices of our Service Members to ensure our freedom. We believe it is our duty to help support this blood drive and pay respect to the legacy of Dr. Charles R. Drew." Dr. Charles R. Drew was no stranger to Europe and the military. During World War II, he used his ingenuity to develop and apply his "Blood Banks" concept as the full-time medical director of the Blood for Britain project. In February 1941, the first American Red Cross Blood Bank appointed him director, overseeing the storage and supply of blood for use by the U.S. Army and Navy.



The flight, being the first of its kind, highlights diversity, equality, and inclusion within the ranks of the Air Force. Brother Patrick was born in St. Elizabeth, Jamaica, and enlisted in the Air Force in March 2010.

Brother Patrick has been in the Air Force for 13 years and is the Non-Commissioned Officer in Charge (NCOIC) of Religious Affairs for the 693 Intelligence, Surveillance, and Reconnaissance Group on Ramstein Air Base.

The culminating event that concluded the ceremony was a pot-luck-style meal tailored to the theme of black history provided to all that participated.

The Brothers of Phi Gamma Gamma set up a table to provide information about the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity Incorporated and its history.

The Brothers of Phi Gamma Gamma displayed, via a PowerPoint presentation, pictures and information about the Fraternity founders and photographs of the community service that the brothers of Phi Gamma Gamma had done.

The brothers discussed the ten internationally mandated programs enacted at the National. District, and Local levels and talked about the importance of the history behind Omega Psi Phi Fraternity Incorporated. The brothers of Phi Gamma Gamma also used this event to fellowship amongst brethren.

"Theta Rho Revitalizes the Heritage of the Tuskegee Airmen in Italy" - by Bruce B. Jones, Brothers of the Theta Rho Chapter currently stationed at Aviano Air Base in Italy are uplifting the heritage of the Tuskegee Airmen who served as military aviators and support personnel in Italy during World Warll.

The Tuskegee Airmen persevered through segregation, stereotypes and prejudice to become one of the most highly respected fighter groups of World War II with four hundred and fifty of the Tuskegee Army Air Field pilots serving in the 332nd Fighter Group's 99th, 100th, 301st, and 302nd fighter squadrons in Italy.

Brothers Bruce B. Jones, Emanuel Martin and Franklin Walton are leading the only "overseas" organization dedicated to memorializing the Tuskegee contributions to American and Italian history while also educating and inspiring the next generation of leaders through diversity, inclusiveness and scholarship.

The effort began when Brother Jones and others at Aviano Air Base remembered the reference to Italy in George Lucas's "Red Tails" movie. Upon finding the location, they decided to "walk the grounds" of where these heroes were assigned.

This led to the discovery of Ramitelli and the historic airfield where the Airmen flew their P-51 "Red Tails" aircraft which logged one of the best fighter escort mission records in WWII.

After the war, many of the airfields used by the Allies were celebrated with ceremonies by dignitaries and descendants of the pilots who flew from these locations. At that time, no one represented the Tuskegee Airmen and Ramitelli became one of the forgotten airfields of WWII. The airfield is now farmland and vineyards but remnants of the "Red Tails" 332nd Operations Headquarters building are still visible today.

With industry and ingenuity, Brother Jones built support for recognizing the airfield and the Tuskegee aviators through the US Embassy in Rome and Naples bringing Italy-wide attention to the importance of these historic landmarks.

Aviano Brothers coordinated multiple visits to the sites and Campomarino and San Martino in Pensilis, the two towns the Tuskegee Airmen spent their time when they were not flying combatmissions.

With these networks in place, festivals and plans to build commemorative parks and monuments to officially recognize Ramitelli Airfield and the Tuskegee Airmen are in the works.

Italian families are also sharing untold stories from their descendants to highlight their contributions to the history of these African American heroes. As the Brothers of Theta Rho at Aviano help in these historical endeavors, they are also educating the general public on the Tuskegee Airmen achievements within Italy, promoting diversity and inclusion for the military and providing scholarship opportunities for families stationed outside the continental United States.

The organization was designated a 501(c) (3) non-profit status by the IRS to allow for tax-free donations, IN 87-3449091, to support scholarly aspirations.

They are also exposing young people to positive stories of people of color that will hopefully open their eyes and minds to the endless possibilities of learning despite societal perceptions based onrace.

Despite adversity, restraints and limited opportunities, the Tuskegee Airmen proved conclusively that African Americans had the intelligence and aptitude to fly sophisticated combat aircraft, inspiring revolutionary reform in the Armed Forces and preserving the heritage of all those who served.







International fraternity Omega Psi Phi, Inc. has made a donation of \$5,000 to the University of the Virgin Islands (UVI) in support of the University's strategic initiatives.

During a check presentation ceremony held on Wednesday, Oct. 5, on the Albert A. Sheen Campus in St. Croix, Dr. Byron Biscoe, who serves as Omega Psi Phi's Deputy District Representative for the Caribbean, shared that the organization, which upholds the core principles of "Manhood, Scholarship, Perseverance and Uplift," offers many opportunities for VI students to participate in Greek life, serve their communities and develop into adults of strong character and integrity.

"We are so grateful to Omega Psi Phi for making this generous contribution to UV at a time when we are deeply engaged in activities related to meeting the goals of our Greatness Through Innovation Strategic Plan." said UVI President Dr. David Hall.

"This gift strengthens our longstanding relationship with Omega Psi Phi and symbolizes our ongoing mutual commitment to transforming the lives of Virgin Islanders both within and without our academic walls through service and mentorship," he added.

The Greek organization, which is active on the Albert A. Sheen Campus - St. Croix (Eta lota lota chapter) and the Orville E. Kean Campus - St. Thomas (Zeta Xi chapter), directed funds to UVI as part of its annual College Endowment Fund activities, which are used to support historically Black colleges and universities (HBCU) across the United States.

This is the first time that the University of the Virgin Islands has been the recipient of a direct gift from Omega Psi Phi's international headquarters. The UVI chapters represent the fraternity's 13th International District.



Community service activities Omega Psi Phi has spearheaded in the U.S. Virgin Islands include supporting residences for the elderly, cleaning up parks and recreation spaces, coaching youth baseball teams and providing swimming lessons, mentorship experiences and speaking to young people in schools across the Territory.

"Omega Psi Phi has always been committed to supporting, empowering and nurturing young men, grooming them for service in and to local communities, and it is our pleasure and honor to make this donation to UVI on behalf of our members," said Dr. Biscoe, who specializes in surgery and diseases of the eye and will serve as Associate Professor of Ophthalmology at UVI's School of Medicine, which is in the applicant phase of its opening plans.

He has also been an active fundraiser on behalf of the University, hosting events in both St. Thomas and St. Croix to raise money to support UVI's mission. "We are proud to treasure many of the core values and ideals the University also holds dear as an HBCU."

Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. is the first international fraternal organization founded on the campus of a historically Black college. There are a total of six chapters in the Caribbean region For more information, contact pr@uvi.edu.







PGG SUPPORT TO THE HOMELESS



The Brothers Of Phi Gamma Gamma Chapter Support the Saint Christophorus Homeless Shelter in Kaiserslautern, Germany On 25 March 2023, the Brothers of Phi Gamma Gamma Chapter in Kaiserslautern, Germany, collected and donated over \$500 in hygiene products to the local homeless shelter, St Christophorus.

PGG has formed a consistent relationship with St Christophorus providing winter clothing in the fall and summer clothing in the spring. PGG's clothing drives for the shelter have been so successful that the shelter's coffers of clothing are bursting at the seams, and the shelter asked the Brothers for more specific items to provide to its patrons.

Since its chartering in 2018, the Brothers of PGG have led clothing drives in the Kaiserslautern Military Community each spring and fall to provide items to needy individuals.

The chapter Basileus, Brother Andre Pippen, pushes the chapter to find those less fortunate in the local community to support, including patrons of the local victims of domestic violence shelter.

PGG'S upcoming support to the homeless shelter will focus on socks and undergarments for those in need.







Under the Food Standards Code, Standard 3.2.2 Food Safety Practices and General Requirements, food handlers are responsible for ensuring that they do not contaminate food and make it unsafe or unsuitable for consumption. Food handlers also have specific responsibilities related to their health and hygiene. The food handler's certification course ensures students understand how food should be stored, transported, and maintained in any environment to maintain its integrity.

The brothers of Phi Gamma Gamma attended the food handler's course at the Landstuhl Regional Medical Center to obtain the necessary certification to cook, prepare, serve, pack, display, and store food. The course emphasized the importance of proper hygiene, sanitation, and the use of appropriate protective equipment, at all times, during the process of food management. The food handler's certification will ensure the safety of participants while conducting events that align with the mandated programs of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity Incorporated.

South Korea - On the weekend of September 2, 2023, a group of dedicated Brothers from the Lambda Xi Chapter, located in the Republic of South Korea, embarked on a meaningful journey to Pattaya, Thailand. Their mission: to spread love, kindness, and support to the children of the Pattaya Orphanage/Children's Home Foundation Pattaya.

This heartwarming endeavor saw approximately 80 children benefit from the generosity of the Lambda Xi Chapter members. The brothers pooled their resources and spent 10000 Baht, the local currency in Thailand, which is roughly equivalent to \$300 in U.S. currency. With this money, they purchased an array of treats, including chips, cookies, chocolate bars, water, and juice, all of which were donated to the orphanage. Brother Chase Woodson, one of the members who participated in the visit, described the experience as truly eyeopening.
