

A LIFETIME OF DISTINGUISHED SERVICE: HONORING HIS EXCELLENCY DAVIDSON LINCOLN HEPBURN, OBE

For seven decades, His Excellency Davidson Lincoln Hepburn, OBE, has exemplified the true spirit of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. and its cardinal principles of manhood, scholarship, perseverance, and uplift. From his initiation in 1955 to his global service as a statesman and scholar, Dr. Hepburn has embodied what it means to be an Omega man.

A LIFETIME OF OMEGA EXCELLENCE



Born on December 7, 1932, in Douds, New Bight, Cat Island, The Bahamas, Dr. Hepburn's journey is one of relentless dedication and achievement. He was initiated into Omega Psi Phi on December 9, 1955, and quickly emerged as a leader among his peers. As Basileus of his chapter from 1957 to 1958, he strengthened the brotherhood's foundation on campus while advancing academic excellence and service. These ideals would guide his life for decades to come.

Dr. Hepburn's deep commitment to Omega never wavered. Through the years, he remained an active and inspiring presence in the fraternity, embodying its principles not only in fraternal life but in every sphere of his distinguished career. In recognition of his unwavering devotion, Grand Basileus Brother George Grace personally traveled to Nassau to present Dr. Hepburn with his Fifty-Year Pin, a rare honor celebrating his lifelong loyalty to the fraternity. Later, Omega honored him again with the Sixty-Year Pin, marking more than six decades of faithful service and mentorship.



His Omega light shone beyond chapter walls. As an educator, diplomat, and cultural ambassador, Dr. Hepburn carried the fraternity's values to the global stage. He served as President of the 35th Session of the UNESCO General Conference, represented The Bahamas as Ambassador to the United Nations, and led international efforts promoting education, peace, and cultural understanding. Through every post, he demonstrated that Omega men are called not just to lead, but to serve humanity.

In the Bahamas, Dr. Hepburn became a role model for generations of young men; mentoring, teaching, and inspiring through his quiet strength and towering example. Whether addressing global leaders at UNESCO or guiding youth programs at home, he embodied the Omega mission: to uplift others through excellence and integrity.

Today, as a revered elder of the fraternity, Dr. Hepburn stands as living proof that the ideals of Omega Psi Phi endure through a lifetime of purpose. His story reminds every brother that the real measure of fraternal service is not just in years, but in impact — and his has been profound. Dr. Hepburn's life continues to inspire both within and beyond Omega, a shining example of leadership anchored in faith, brotherhood, and an unbreakable commitment to service.

MAKING HISTORY: THE 13TH DISTRICT'S IHQ ACHIEVEMENTS

Detroit, Michigan – Since the realignment of the international chapters to form the 13th District on 3 December 1993, many Omega Men have aspired to see their Brothers recognized at the International Headquarter (IHQ) level for their service to Her cause. While the work speaks for itself, quantifying it has proven difficult, but the men of the 13th District are not ones to shy away from adversity. A valiant effort has consistently been made, and Achievement Week Committee Chair, Bro. Christopher Infantry, has worked tirelessly to refine those efforts.

On 26 July 2025, the efforts put forth finally paid off and history was once again made in the 13th District. Bro. Landis Maddox and Bro. Robert Taylor were respectively recognized as IHQ's Brigadier General (BG) Charles Young Military Leadership Award and Graduate Omega Man of the Year Award winners. As the first recipients of these awards in the 13th District, telling their story was important.

A graduate of the United States Military Academy, Bro. Maddox, was initiated into our illustrious Fraternity in the Spring of 1996 through the Phi Nu Chapter. Since then, he has balanced holding different offices in fourteen chapters, many of which were in the 13th District, with achieving success as a Sustainment General Officer. BG Young helped pave the way for Black officers to be recognized as leaders within the military, so to win this award as a West Point graduate and BG is pretty significant.

When asked how it feels to receive this award, he stated "It is one of the most meaningful awards I've received in my life." This award signifies more than what he accomplished this Omega Year, but rather it is a culmination of the efforts of his mentors, soldiers, and friends in and out of the Fraternity that have impacted who he is over the last 29 years.

To the young Brothers that aspire to be successful in Omega and in life, he offered this advice, "Surround yourself with positive people, people that are doing better than you with like ideas and ambitions." In short, Bro Maddox's advice is to be intentional and realistic by setting goals and continuously measuring yourself against them. It is your race to win or lose and your only competition is you. Additionally, he spoke on the importance of seeking out mentors that align with your goals because good fellowship is a foundational skill for effective leadership.

He currently serves as the Basileus of Chi Mu Mu Chapter in the United Kingdom and the Assistant District Keeper of Finance for the 13th District.

He too was asked how this award win feels, to which he responded "Amazing! To be the first in the district to win at the IHQ level is a huge accomplishment, not for me or the chapter, but for the district as a whole." The since of pride in winning is only compounded by the fact that he entered this great Fraternity through the 13th District, but nonetheless he credits this accomplishment to his former Basileus, Bro. Cortez Pree, and the Brothers of Sigma Gamma Gamma Chapter that believed he was worthy of being counted amongst them. DRs Trevor Hodge, Tracy George, and Freddie Thompson as well as the Brothers of Chi Mu Mu were all credited as influences.

Like many Brothers, he feels an obligation to live up to the expectations set by his sponsors and MSP Chair, so that they never second guess the role they played in his journey. To the young Brothers that aspire to be recognized within the fraternity, he had this to say, "Don't chase the award, just put in the work and let your work speak for itself." While not a Cardinal Principle, Service is our watchword and an essential aspect of every Omega Man, so aspiring to be the hardest working Brother in the chapter, district, or fraternity, will bring the recognition that is deserved.

THETA RHO SUPPORTS VICENZA JROTC CIP LAUNCH



Invited by Brother Raymond Bell, Chairman of the International Headquarters of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. Fatherhood and Mentoring Committee, Brother Robinson contributed to a lively question and answering session. Discussions included the upcoming rebranding of the national fatherhood and mentoring initiative to "Omega Uplift," a move intended to unify programming and increase funding opportunities across all districts.

In the evening, he participated in the "Brother You're On My Mind" event, a powerful session focusing on mental health and emotional wellness among the Brotherhood. The initiative, born out of personal tragedy and first introduced in 2017, has become a cornerstone of Omega's commitment to mental health. The session emphasized creating safe spaces, recognizing the lasting effects of the pandemic, and supporting one another through honest dialogue.



To conclude Friday's full schedule, Brother Robinson attended the International High School Talent Hunt Program, showcasing the extraordinary abilities of young artists from across the country. 



In June 2025, Brother Brandon Wilkins (Delta Pi-2011) led the deployment of two units following short-notice taskings from higher headquarters. He directed a 17-member team that successfully deployed 475 personnel and 878.3 tons of equipment via 21 C-17 aircraft within 96 hours. His team worked tirelessly around the clock to coordinate and secure all airlift requirements. This effort marked the first and largest F-35 deployment from the European Command's Area of Responsibility, a critical component of Operation Midnight Hammer, which resulted in the destruction of three Iranian nuclear facilities. For his exceptional leadership and dedication, Brother Wilkins was coined by Brigadier General Jack Arthaud, Commander of the 48th Fighter Wing. Additionally, his team was recognized as Team of the Quarter for the second quarter of 2025.
